Judith Auerbach, United States

Dr. Judith Auerbach is a sociologist, independent science and policy consultant, and Professor in the School of Medicine at the University of California San Francisco. She previously served in leadership positions in governmental (NIH and White House) and non-profit (amfAR, San Francisco AIDS Foundation) organizations. Judy received her Ph.D. in Sociology from UC Berkeley, and has taught, presented, and published widely in the areas of HIV/AIDS, social science, public policy, and sex and gender. She serves on numerous professional and advisory groups, including, the PEPFAR Scientific Advisory Board, the National Advisory Council on Drug Abuse (NIDA), and the Governing Council of the International AIDS Society. Judy was a founder of the Association of Social Sciences and Humanities in HIV. She has received numerous awards including the 2014 Feminist-Scholar-Activist Award from the Sex and Gender

Section of the American Sociological Association. Her research interests focus on the social organization of scientific knowledge, specifically, the role and standing of social research, and attention to women in the HIV/AIDS response.
